Serving to send Workers

The apostle Paul said, "And how shall they preach unless they are sent?" In Romans chapter 10 he establishes the need for cross-cultural outreach at these two levels of involvement: those who go and those who serve by sending.

First Paul quoted Joel: "For whosoever shall call upon the Name of the Lord shall be saved." Then, using the clear logic so easily understood by the Roman mind, he asked, "And how will they call upon one in whom they have not believed? And how will they believe in him of whom they have not heard?" And how will they hear without a preacher?"

Yes, there must be a "preacher"-a missionary, a cross-cultural worker, one who goes. Whatever his name is, and however he goes, there has to be one who proclaims the Good News. God decided that this would be the way.
